

AT THE CRASH SCENE

Is it Safe?

If you can see/hear danger nearby (oncoming traffic/ broken glass), ensure your safety.

Are you Injured?

- Call 911 or ask someone to call for you.
- Stay calm, still, and assess injuries.
- Avoid sudden movements.
- Ask driver to stay at scene and to provide name, phone, license plate and driver's license number.
- Take pictures or video of resting positions of car, bike and surroundings.
- Get witness info and ask them to remain at scene.

Police Attending the Crash Scene?

- Record name and badge number of officer.
- Ask for transport help from scene if no ambulance required.

Go to the Hospital?

- Give full account of your symptoms.
- Inquire about X-rays, CT Scans, or other diagnostic imaging.

Don't Go to the Hospital?

- See doctor ASAP.
- If no police at scene, file report ASAP.
- Call ICBC Dial-A-Claim (604.520.8222) and get claim # and report collision.
