HUB Cycling is a charitable not-for-profit organization established in 1998 to improve cycling conditions in Metro Vancouver. Since then, we've grown a lot! HUB Cycling has 10 Local Committees, representing 18 Metro Vancouver municipalities, that meet monthly to discuss cycling issues specific to each municipality, and a Regional Advisory Committee that works on regional and provincial issues. We've also expanded our team of staff, and we now have a bike ed team, a research team, and an events team who all work to get more people cycling more often.

Our voice: Members make a difference

HUB Cycling is a membership-based organization with close to 3,000 members and more than 40,000 direct supporters. When you become a HUB member, you are directly supporting the work that we do in Metro Vancouver by increasing our credibility and giving us a strong voice to ensure decision-makers know that there is a demand for safer, more connected, and convenient ways to get around by bike.




What do Local Committees do?

Our Local Committees do lots of different things, with one mission: to get more people cycling more often.



- · writing letters to government
- · meeting with decision makers
- providing feedback on projects
- building relationships with stakeholders

- · conducting assessment rides
- identifying gaps in the cycling network
- connecting with stakeholders and decision makers to fill gaps



Events

- having a presence in the community through events
- participating in HUB events such as Go By Bike Week



Building Community

- connecting with community members and groups to grow HUB's membership
- building allies and relationships in the community
